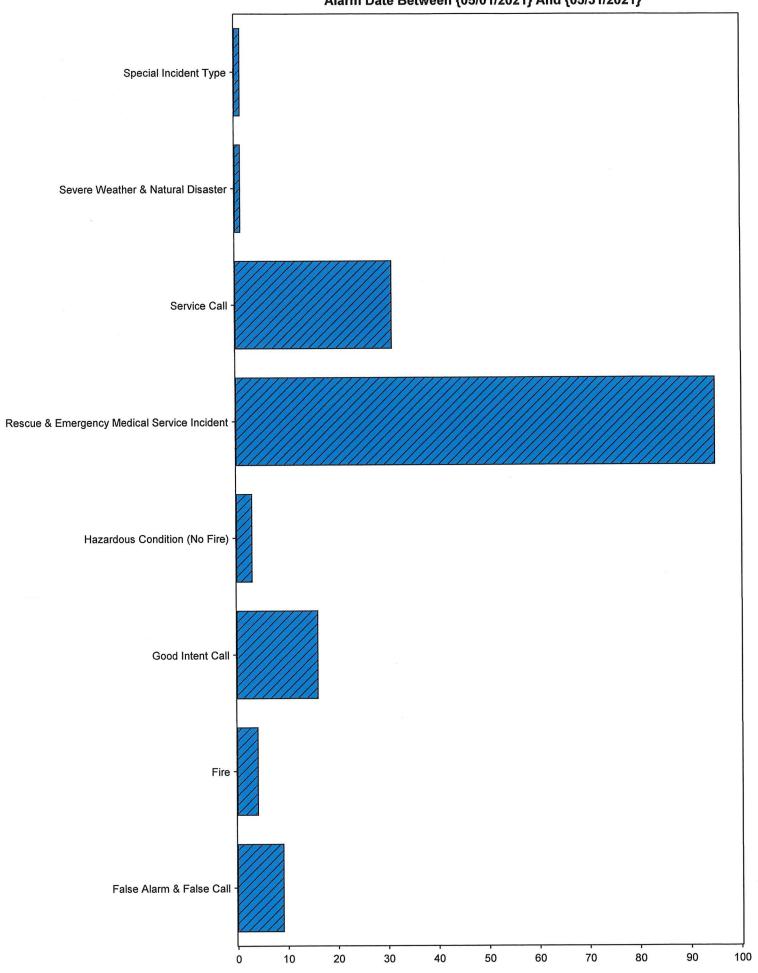

Public Safety Telecommunications Report June 2021

- 1. Monthly Call Statistics sheet is available. Activity for May is approximately 5,201 incidents, approximately 2,306 911 calls and about 9,800 administrative calls.
- 2. Staffing update; One Dispatcher has retired in April and another in May. Staffing is at 18 and full staffing is 21. All 18 are fully on line. At 18 personnel all shifts are covered for weekly staffing. However, all vacations, sick or other leave require overtime replacement on 5 of 7 days a week.
- 3. Lead Dispatcher position that was vacated by retirement is in process of being filled. That should be completed no later than June 15, 2021.
- 4. LOCIP process started for replacement of a HVAC unit at one of our radio sites. This was not a new facility like most of the project. This was an abandoned Nextel site we took over. The cost estimation is \$8,500 \$10,000.
- 5. August meeting suspension discussion needed in July WEBEX meeting.
