





On May 11, 2022 at approximately 01:35, Middletown Central Dispatch received a report of smoke in the building at 174 Freeman Road. Being assigned as Bravo position on Engine 32, you and your crew were engaged in a brush fire operation in the area of Freeman Road.

As Car 10-3 responded to investigate, you assisted the crew and placed your engine back in service to assist, if needed. Enroute to the incident, dispatch was updating units that occupants were trapped on the second floor and that the smoke volume was increasing. Arriving on scene, 10-3 confirmed a working fire and that 4 occupants were trapped on the second floor and were in need of assistance.

As Engine 32 arrived on scene, you along with Firefighter Turenne stretched an attack line into the structure to search for the seat of the fire. As the line was being stretched, you and Firefighter Turenne proceeded to the second floor to ensure the victims safety. Knowing the victims were secured, your team made their way to the basement to contain and extinguish the fire.

Your individual actions along with the actions of your team, certainly saved the lives of two adults and two children trapped in the bedroom.

This letter of accommodation is a small acknowledgement of your quick actions, abilities and determination under a stressful situation. Your display of knowledge, skills and abilities reflect the true values of the fire service. Job well done!

Good Evening,

I wanted to take a moment to share how proud I am of the outstanding efforts our members have gone to in the last 24 hrs to protect lives and property. Obviously, most are aware of the enormity of the brush fires on River Rd/Aircraft Rd areas, and the challenges that those presented.

The event that largely went under the radar occurred shortly after 1am, after our crews had already been battling the brush fires for 12hrs.

At 1:34am, Dispatch received a 911 call from a residence on Freeman Rd, reporting a smoke condition in the house. Information was relayed to Chief Trzaski, who was very close by monitoring their brush fire with Engine 32 & Middlefield Tanker 5. While en route, Dispatcher Nick DeJohn relayed that the residents, 2 adults and 2 small children, were trapped in a bedroom on the second floor, being overcome by smoke and unable to escape. Dispatch remained on the phone with the occupants to reassure them and maintain contact until units could get there.

Chief Trzaski arrived within 2 minutes and entered the building to locate the trapped occupants, in zero visibility conditions without the aid of breathing apparatus. He was able to locate the victims and began assisting them onto the roof through a broken window. Engine 32 arrived immediately behind Chief Trzaski. Lieutenant Heiden rapidly deployed a ground ladder to the roof, removing the children and adults off the roof with the aid of Firefighter Davis-Penta. At the same time, Firefighters Tyrseck and Turenne, with the help of Middlefield personnel, deployed a hand line to extinguish the fire that was located in the basement.

All of the occupants were transported to area hospitals for evaluation but are expected to make a full recovery. Additional apparatus from South District, Portland, Westfield and Middletown Fire arrived shortly after to assist in additional fire suppression, ventilation, and overhaul.

The crucial parts of this incident occurred within minutes. From the time of the initial call, to victim removal was 7 minutes. There is zero doubt that without the swift actions of our personnel, coupled with pure luck of their location and the exceptional efforts of our dispatchers, that this fire would have claimed the lives of 4 people. In my opinion, a formal commendation for these members is in order.

This is further proof that no matter what rank our members hold, they are always firefighters first and foremost. Our department may be small, but we have proven time and time again that we are able to improvise, adapt and overcome.

Never bet against us.

- 1. Monthly Call Statistics sheet is available. Activity for August is approximately 5,418 incidents. Total 911 calls are 2,309 and 10,030 administrative calls. The report is attached to this email.
- 2. Staffing update; Staffing is at 16 and full staffing is 21. We are in process of filling the vacant positions. The Lead Dispatcher position as been filled by Collette Cassanova, a thirteen year veteran employee. Two dispatcher positions are in background check process.
- 3. Mile Lane cell site update. AT&T is continuing to pursue the approval from the CT Siting Council. They will be using a crane to take more site pictures for the process. The process was delayed from last month.
- 4. Radio site work clearing of brush is done annually at three sites owned by the City. This is being done in August and September.
- 5. Annual site generator maintenance is on schedule for this month.
- 6. New period of Radio Maintenance contract with Motorola has begun. That cost is approximately \$172,500 for July to December 31, 2022.
