Achieving CPP-T and PRP credentials is a rigorous process that involves four examinations, both oral and written, and extensive hands-on experience with a variety of organizations and boards. Individuals must not only demonstrate knowledge of at least five parliamentary authorities, including the most recent edition of the AIP Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure and of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, but also display



competency in evaluating governing documents, serving as a presiding officer, drafting opinions and supplementary materials, training on procedural concepts, and advising on procedural rules and strategy.

Sarah passed all four examinations nearly twenty years ago, and since then she has served countless national, regional, state, and local clients, providing the knowledge they need to make sound decisions in an efficient manner.
